

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-40

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE THE EXPENDITURE OF ADDITIONAL FUNDS FROM THE STATES OF OREGON AND CALIFORNIA FOR FIRE CONFLAGRATION COSTS INCURRED IN THE GENERAL FUND FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020-21

WHEREAS, Oregon Local Budget Law (ORS 294.471(1)(c)) allows the expenditure of funds that are made available by another unit of federal, state or local government and the availability of which could not reasonably be foreseen when preparing the original budget or a previous supplemental budget for the current year or current budget period; and

WHEREAS, the City of Forest Grove (City) has or will receive fire conflagration reimbursement funds from the States of Oregon and California in the amount of \$238,345 for personnel costs incurred by the City for staffing costs related to the fire conflagrations; and

WHEREAS, these funds have been paid to staff; and

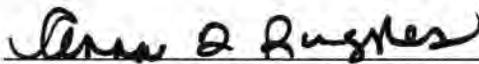
WHEREAS, the expenditure of the additional funds needs to be appropriated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF FOREST GROVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. In the General Fund, State Fire Conflagration Reimbursement Revenue (revenue line item 1002200 4170) will be increased by \$238,345. Fire Department Regular Wages appropriations (expenditure line item 1002200 5000) will be increased by \$40,000; Fire Department Overtime Costs (expenditure line item 1002200 5300) will be increased by \$178,345; and Fire Department Vehicle Maintenance and Operating Supplies (expenditure line item 1002200 6345) will be increased by \$20,000. Total Fire Department appropriations in the General Fund are increased by \$238,345 to \$5,350,377.

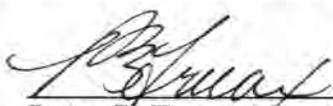
Section 2. This resolution is effective immediately upon its enactment by the City Council.

ISSUE STATEMENT: The adopted budget for a fiscal year is based upon best estimates at the time the budget is adopted. During the fiscal year, unanticipated events may occur and actual expenditures become known.

At the end of the fiscal year, it is standard procedure to review expenditures throughout the budget and to modify appropriations, which are legal expenditure limits, for expenditures which may exceed the appropriated levels by the end of the fiscal year. ORS Chapter 294 permits the governing body to transfer appropriations within a fund so the budgeted appropriations are not exceeded. The attached resolution authorizes the appropriation transfers necessary for FY 2020-21.

BACKGROUND: Upon review of the preliminary year-to-date expenditures as of June 11, 2021, staff has prepared a resolution for Council consideration to avoid potential appropriation over expenditures in the General Fund, the Building Permits Fund, the Fire Equipment Replacement Fund, and the Light & Power Fund at the end of FY 2020-21. The reasons for the proposed transfers are discussed below. The numbers for the reasons correspond to the transfer numbers in the proposed resolution:

1. In the Engineering Department, appropriations need to be increased by \$25,000 to pay for personnel costs being higher due to changes in salary adjustments and employees' insurance coverage levels.
2. In the Fire Department, appropriations need to be increased by \$144,000 to pay for: 1) \$84,000 for professional services for the interim Fire Chief contract; and 2) \$60,000 for expenditures related to COVID-19 mitigation for which reimbursement from CARES funds was received.
3. In the Building Permits Fund, a transfer from Contingency of \$80,000 to Intergovernmental Services to pay for the State Building Surplus Charges and

inspection assistance by other agencies being higher than budgeted due to significantly higher than expected building activity in the City of Cornelius.

4. In the Light and Power Fund, \$500,000 will be transferred from Contingency to Power Purchases to pay for the actual costs of power purchases which are covered by additional revenue from higher electric sales.

FISCAL IMPACT: Fiscal impact was explained above.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends the City Council approve the attached resolution transferring appropriations within the FY 2020-21 Budget.
