This vernacular residence is a blend of several 19th century styles. Eastlake decoration is visible in the gable peak and the window bay. The wall dormer and narrow bay windows are remnants of the Gothic Revival style. During the 1870's and 1880's, these styles and the Queen Anne style were often mixed by local vernacular builders.

The house is in fair condition. Unfortunate alterations such as the aluminum sliding window on the front elevation detract from the integrity of the house. Other windows and trim remain. The bulls-eye window decoration is only seen on two other houses in the Original Town Plat.

**Statement of Historical and Architectural Significance:**

Reportedly built by Harvey Baldwin, a brickmason in 1920, this building is a simple 1 story bungalow cottage with a few decorative bungalow elements. Two Baldwin brothers appear on the 1910 census and both worked as bricklayers. George H. Baldwin (b.Illinois 1878/79) lived on Ash Street in 1910 and James W. Baldwin (b. Illinois 1870/71) lived on A Street in 1910.

It is difficult to determine which Baldwin actually built the house. Although "Harvey" does not appear on the 1910 census, he could have moved to Forest Grove later. In addition, George H. Baldwin could be "Harvey". Also, James actually lived on A Street in 1910, so determining which brother built the house is difficult without further information.
