

Statement of Historical and Architectural Significance:

The Elder House is a mix of minimal Queen Anne and Classical Revival styles. The encircling porch is remnant of the Queen Anne style, while the prominent pedimented gable atop a two story rectangular window bay gives the house a classical look. Tuscan columns support the large porch. The main house has a low pitch hip roof with shiplap siding. The ornament on this house is restrained, without the lavish detail often seen in either style.

The house is in good condition and has not been significantly altered. Two large fixed windows in the window bay are replacements.

John Elder was born in Kentucky in 1857. He married Mary [b. 1866 in Iowa] in 1884. They were living in Oregon by 1887. In 1910 Elder was retired and living with Mary, daughter Lillian and a son at 1616 Birch. Lillian was teaching music lessons. A later owner is listed as a Mrs. Gardner, a widow. It is safe to assume that this was Lillian. She lived there in the 1920's with relatives, including her nephew Lamborn.

It is interesting to note that while Lamborn was listed as Lillian's brother in the 1910 census, it is odd that Mary Elder would have 2 children 21 years apart. A third sibling is unaccounted for. Perhaps that person is Lanborn's parent.

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

Statement of Historical and Architectural Significance:

This house is a good example of once common vernacular homes built in Forest Grove in the late 1800's. It is a variant on the Western Farmhouse — Rural Gothic style. Other elements include Eastlake treatment of the canted window bay and a frieze panel.

The house has been altered somewhat, with a gable roofed addition on the rear elevation and a replaced front porch. Overall, the home is in good condition and it retains its setting among mature oak trees set back from Birch Street.



Statement of Historical and Architectural Significance:

The Rasmussen House is a fine example of a design by E. A. Jerome, a prominent Forest Grove architect at the turn of the century. This house, like the Peterson House on 18th Avenue, combines Queen Anne and Colonial Revival elements. The house was constructed in 1905, as the Queen Anne style was waning and before the Colonial Revival style was replaced in popularity by the Craftsman style.

The house is in good condition and has not been significantly altered. A large encircling porch, multiple pitch roof and decorative windows are the significant Queen Anne elements. The pilaster cornerboards and pedimented gable ends are Colonial Revival features.

James Rasmussen was born in Denmark in 1851. He emigrated to the United States in 1872. His wife Hanson was born in Denmark in 1864. She emigrated to the United States in 1878. James became a naturalized citizen and they married in 1883. In 1910 they were living at 1653 Birch. James was a merchant in Forest Grove and owned a feed store. Their 4 youngest children were all born in Oregon, where they resided by 1888.

Among their children was Jennie who was 22 in 1910. That same year Henry Price, 25, a professor at Pacific University was a boarder in the house. The two later married and lived in the house until her death.

Exterior Alterations/Additions (Dated): Extensive modifications were made to the building in 1943-44. Dry rot required new exterior surfacing of shingles and clapboard siding. In addition, the curvilinear parapet features on the gable ends were eliminated, leaving a simple gable end. The fenestration and stained glass remained, however. Doors and a porch on the W elevation were also replaced. A 1942 building built immediately to the E to house children's activities was connected to the main church with a breezeway.





Statement of Historical and Architectural Significance:

A lot 150 feet deep between 18th and 19th Avenues along the E side of Birch Street was purchased in 1881 by Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church. The current Church of Christ was built in 1911 as the Methodist Episcopal Church. An existing parsonage built in 1891 on the site was sold and moved to a new lot facing 19th Avenue to make room for the 1911 church.

The \$16,000 M. E. Church was reportedly designed by Forest Grove resident F. M. Starrett. While a F. M. Starrett does not appear on the 1910 census, a Porter C. Starrett does. The latter Starrett was employed as a contractor. It is unclear whether F. M. Starrett was misidentified in a March 16, 1911 issue of the Forest Grove *News-Times*, or if he had a brother in the construction business. Either is possible.

The Mission style was popular starting in 1910 for the construction of church buildings. Drawing inspiration from the early missions in California history, this style remained popular for many years between 1910 and 1925. The Canby, Oregon Methodist Church was constructed in a similar style in 1913.

Dry rot and other water damage led church leaders to order a remodel in 1943-44. Wood shingles and clapboard were applied to the exterior to stave off dampness and the curvilinear parapets were removed. The latter is most unfortunate, as the resulting plain gable ends make it hard to identify this as a Mission building. However, the remarkable stained glass work remains unaltered.

The Methodist Church sold their church building to the Church of Christ in 1978 when the Methodist Church built a new building at 17th and Cedar.



Will Ebert built this house around 1938. He rented it to Clyde Walker until it was sold to Myron Ray in 1949. Later it was obtained by Mrs. Ralph Haskins.

The house is a simple vernacular structure. It lacks eaves or ornament, which is typical of such styles as Cape Cod Colonial that appeared in the 1930's as a response to the downturn in the economy. Early post WW II houses often look similar, although some are 10 years younger.



Statement of Historical and Architectural Significance:

1816 Birch is an excellent example of a working class Vernacular/Bungalow house. Decorative elements from high class Craftsman homes are present, including bargeboards and purlins with braces. The shingle siding in the gable ends is a reminder that the Craftsman style borrowed heavily from the shingle style.

The house is in good condition and has been altered very little. The low pitch gable porch on the E elevation is uncommon, but may well be original.

The house was originally located on the S side of 18th Avenue between Birch and Cedar. It was moved when work started in the Methodist Church annex.



The exact year is unclear, but 1910-1912 is a probable range.

The American Foursquare is a common sub-type in Forest Grove. These houses appeared between 1895 and 1915 and were a blend of Colonial Revival and Craftsman/Bungalow forms. They featured hip roofs, full width porches, were often two stories in height and square in plan. In addition, they usually had a central dormer on the front elevation and 1/1 DHS windows. This house has many of those features.

The Methodist Church sold their church building to the Church of Christ in 1978 when the Methodist Church built a new building at 17th and Cedar. It is not clear when the parsonage was converted to multi-family housing, although current zoning does allow this. This information should be available.
